

Why Pray With a Group

The Power of Corporate Prayer

1. The agreement and power of corporate prayer brings God into situations to work His work. Psalm 14:5b, Matt. 18:19-20, Ro. 15:30-32.
2. Corporate prayer brings unbroken communion with God and others, demonstrates God's power, and the salvation of many. Acts 2:42-47.
3. Corporate praise and prayers set our hearts on the sovereignty of God, ushers in His presence, casts out fear and sets our will on God proclaim His word. Acts 4:21-31.
4. Corporate praise unites us with the atmosphere of the throne room, reminding us that continual praise and worship prepares us for heaven. Ps. 68:24, Rev. 4:6-11, 5:8-9.
5. Corporate praise looses chains, sets captives free, opens prison doors and results in salvation of whole households. Acts 16:25-34.
6. The prevailing prayer of the church opens the doors to the supernatural work of God and causes God to dispatch angels to work for us and expedite the answers to our prayers. Acts 12:5-12.
7. Corporate prayer opens the door for evangelism, releases the word of God to spread and brings many to salvation. Col. 4:2-3, 2 Thes. 3:1, Acts 16:13-15, John 17:21-23.
8. One-accord praying produces the atmosphere of obedience and waiting on God in which He displays His promises of power and blessings. Acts 1:4-8, 14, 2:1-2
9. The cry for revival is corporate, as is repentance, holy hatred of sin and pleading for God's mercy in spirit and truth. 2 Chron. 7:14, Neh. 9:1-2, Ezra 9:6, Jer. 3:25, Joel 2:12-18, Psalm 79:8-9, 81:13-14.
10. The acts of gap-standing and wall-building are individual and personal in assignment but are worked out corporately, as we rally to fight for our families, churches, country and God's purposes in the world. Neh. 3 and 4, Eze. 22:30-31.
11. A prayer group is an executive body in the government of the universe to transact kingdom business and enforce God's decrees. Matt 6:10, 18:18, Psalm 149:7-9.
12. Prayer Partners are burden-bearers. Phil. 1:19, Gal. 6:2.
13. God posts watchmen together on the wall to cry out to Him for redemption and restoration of Jerusalem. Is. 52:8-9, 62:6-7.
14. Access to the throne of God is personal and corporate. Eph. 3:12, Heb. 4:16.
15. We come to our Father with others members of His family. Matt. 6:9.
16. In the fellowship of prayer, we receive the love of Christ with others. John 17:26, Eph. 3:18.
17. The land was possessed corporately. Jos. 1:3, Deut. 1:21.
18. Crushing Satan is corporately effective. Rom. 16:17, 19-20, Eph. 1:22-23.
19. Together we can enter into His courts. Rev. 4:8, 5:6-14, Psalm 29:1-2, 9.

20. Corporately, we can enter into His courts. Psalm 100:3-5.
21. The amens of promises of God are plural. 2 Cor. 1:20.
22. Entering into God's perspective is a corporate experience. Rev. 2:7.
23. God shows His glory because of united praise. Rom 15:6, 2 Chron. 5:11-14.
24. Both faith and unbelief can be corporate. Matt. 9:28-29, 13:54-58.
25. God's demonstration of His power is in the church. Eph. 3:20-21.
26. We receive strength and support from others when we are weak. Ro. 15:1-4.
27. Confirmation or correction can be received corporately. Matt. 18:16, Gal. 6:1, Ro. 15:14.
28. God grants vision to people as a body. Pro. 29:18.
29. Jesus intended for His house to be a house of prayer corporately. Mark 11:17.
30. The work that Jesus left in the world was corporate and together we have the power to overcome all the plans of the enemy. Matt.16:18.
31. The call to fasting is sometimes corporate. 2 Chron. 20:3.
32. God's word states, where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am with them. Matt. 18:20.
